Meeting Minutes

President George Hessenbruch, NØIMS, presided over the August meeting; 35 members and visitors attended.

1990 Hamfest Ben, KØPCK, reported that we have signed a contract with the Midway Expo center for next year's Hamfest. We will have the same space that we used this year. Ben had cards printed with the Hamfest information, and members are urged to pass them out to hams in the region.

Repeater controller update Jim, KA9HJP, described the increased lightning protection that has been installed on the club repeater. The controller was returned to service Aug. 3, although some functions still need improvement and must wait for parts from the manufacturer.

ATV repeater The amateur TV repeater is mostly finished and has been moved to Paquin Tower. Operational testing is presently under way. Mike Baker (call pending) reminded members that the ATV repeater signal can be received with a converter that is available in kit form for about \$50. A high-gain 440 MHz antenna will probably also be necessary.

Public service opportunities Two events requested help with communications. One, the Jefferson City Skyfair Airshow, was held the weekend of Aug. 26 and 27, and several CMRA members assisted the Jefferson City club.

The other event, the Multiple Sclerosis 150 bikathon, will be held Sep. 9 and 10. Riders from Kansas City and St. Louis will be meeting at Midway, and several people are needed for help with logistical support. If you can help either or both days, please contact George, NØIMS.

Announcements Charlie Turner, WAØR, planned to operate during the Missouri QSO Party (announced in last month's newsletter) from the club station. Earl Lubensky, KAØOKS, suggested that members make their presence known to Neighborhood Watch groups as a resource for help with communications. Scott Herin, KBØEJY, described the Lunar Eclipse on Aug. 16 and invited members out to the Astronomy Club observation area at Wildhaven.

Club amplifier Jesse, WMØY, requested help with the Heathkit SB-200 amplifier at the club station. It may have a high voltage supply problem. We do not have a manual for it, so if anyone has a copy of the manual or knows where one can be found, please contact a member of the club station committee (NDØN, KBØCDS, WMØY, WAØR, K4CHS).

Club member roster WMØY passed out a draft of the club roster to members at the meeting for correction. A revised copy will be mailed out with the Sep. newsletter.
