ARRL Senior News Editor Rick
Lindquist, N1RL, has been inducted
into the 2007 CQ Amateur Radio Hall
of Fame. CQ magazine, which
sponsors the honor, cited Lindquist for
keeping the amateur community
updated on new developments via
The ARRL Letter, ARRL Audio News
and the ARRL Web news pages. He
will retire June 1.

Commented QST Editor Steve Ford, WB8IMY: "Rick Lindquist started as the ARRL 'Product Review' editor, but he quickly made the transition to news reporting, which was his true calling. In a remarkably short time, Rick became the most recognized name in Amateur Radio journalism."

ARRL Chief Operating Officer Harold Kramer, WJ1B, said, "Rick has been our news editor and reporter through many of the major events in Amateur Radio, including 9/11, Katrina and No-Code Licensing. He has been the print and audio voice of the ARRL during these events and he has reported them accurately, incisively and engagingly." Kramer said Lindquist is "an active contester and DXer with an encyclopedic knowledge of Amateur Radio. He has been especially effective at writing Product Reviews and both writing and editing articles on all aspects of Amateur Radio." For his part, Lindquist said he was "very surprised and honored" to be inducted into the CQ Amateur Radio Hall of Fame.
